
AN OVERVIEW OF WHAT TO EXPECT IN YOUR CHILD'S CLASS THIS YEAR

### Reading

- Always a major school priority to encourage a love of reading.
- Reading underpins learning in other areas of the curriculum
- Year 2 begins with a continuation of phonics lessons
- Whole Class Layered Reading- developing fluency and expression
- Comprehension skills literal questions, prediction and inference
- Phonics support groups with Miss Goodwin and Mrs. Campbell
- Individual reading at home Phonics Book
  Plus Free Choice Class Book/Library Book/Library visit every week

### **Phonics**

- Our school uses the <u>Little Wandle</u> programme
- Reading blending sounds (phonemes) to read words
- Spelling segmenting into sounds and writing the letters (graphemes).
- Tricky words are taught explicitly to children and they will practise both reading and writing these words within lessons
- Phonics Screening Test June 2025 for those in Year 2 who didn't pass in June 2024.

### Writing



- Genres story writing, descriptions, poetry, instructions, information texts and letter writing
- Grammar nouns, verbs, adjectives, adverbs, conjunctions, past and present tenses
- Punctuation capital letters, full stops, question marks, exclamation marks, commas and apostrophes (for possession and contraction)
- Spelling We follow the Rising Stars Scheme which supports the teaching of the Year 2 spelling rules
- Handwriting Penpals scheme (letter formation and joins)

#### Maths

- Number Place Value, Addition, Subtraction, Multiplication and Division
- Geometry 2 D and 3D shape
- Statistics Collection data and presenting information in charts/graphs
- Position and Direction
- Measurement length, weight and capacity
- Problem Solving reasoning activities including the above topics.
- Times Tables 10x, 2x and 5x (moving onto 3x table)

#### Year 2 children:

### Year 2 Computing

- Our computing lessons are on Monday afternoons and are delivered by Mrs. Wheatley with technical support from Mr. Browning our IT Technician.
- This year computing lessons include not only the development of a particular skill but will also focus on keeping ourselves safe when using the internet and online apps with half-termly e-safety lessons.
- Look at the newsletter weekly for top tips which have been discussed in lessons and links to useful websites for information.

### Year 2 Computing

- Autumn 1- Information technology around us how is technology used in school? This half term there will also be a some focus on practising how to log in and develop mouse control.
- Autumn 2 Creating media digital photography. Using iPads to take photographs and begin to edit photographs.
- Spring 1- Programming robot algorithms. Using robot mice to program sequences and create algorithms (set of instructions).
- Spring 2 Creating media making music. Creating musical sequences using Chrome Music Lab.
- Summer 1- Data and Information Pictograms. Linking maths learning to use tally charts to create an online pictogram.
- Summer 2 Programming creating programs using a given design which leads to creating with own design.

- Tricky Words Words to learn which cannot be decoded
- Key Words Certificates awarded for learning each set
- Numbots/Push the Button

- Hat




All property must be clearly named with your child's name.

#### PE
