

We participated in many of the sports competitions organised within Southend. This year this included football for boys and girls, archery, new-age kurling and boccia and inclusive bowling and swimming. We hope to build on this even further in 2024-25. This year, we performed better at the Local Authority's showpiece sports event – KS2 Borough Sports – where we finished 7 th overall and many of our children were placed in their events and then competed again at 'Superports'.

This year children attended the Panathlon inclusive swimming event at the Olympic Park and a local authority ten-pin bowling event.
